## **KEEPING THE MEETING ON TRACK**

### 1. Discussion centers around theory, opinion or advice giving:

"Can you give us a specific example?"

"How has that worked out in your own experience?"

"Does anyone know of an example of ... ?"

### 2. Someone is talking too much:

"Has anyone else had a similar experience?"

"While we're on the subject, let's hear from some of the others."

"Would anyone like to comment on this?"

### 3. A heavy problem has been shared:

"Has anyone found help for this type of problem?"

"How can this group help you?"

### 4. Some have not participated:

"Does anyone who hasn't spoken have any thoughts that he or she would like to share?"

### 5. Someone is talking in vague abstractions:

"Could you illustrate what you're saying with a recent or past experience?"

"Can you give me an example to help me understand what you're saying?"

### 6. Someone gets off the subject:

"That is a very interesting thought, and if you're interested, I would be happy to discuss it further after the meeting; but we need to get back to the subject at hand."
