A. Biblical Perspective

1. Matt 18:20 "...2 or 3 gathered in my name
2. Acts 2:42 "Koinonia"
3. John 11:30-44 "...Unwrap Him and let Him go...."

B. In the context of Koinonia and a relationship with Jesus Christ, how are we to look at each other?

1. (Phil. 2:13) We are people who are in a lifelong process of change with God
"...at work in you both to will and to work His good pleasure."
2. (Roman 7:6) "You are discharged from the law. . . . dead to that which held us captive, so that we serve not under the old written code, but in the new life of the Spirit"

Example

Acts 10 - Peter and Cornelius

Ingredients of the process of change and wholeness -

1. Someone was available to be an instrument in the "unwrapping" process in Peter.
2. A trust level began to be established and thus a new openness for change.
3. There began the gradual removal of old attitudes
"...it is not lawful for a Jew to keep company with anyone of another nationality, but God has shown and taught me by words, that I should not call anyone common or unclean." V. 28
4. There was also the gradual establishment of the new.
truly I perceive that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears Him and does what is right is acceptable to Him. V. 34.
5. It was a supernatural act that enabled Peter to see the above.
6. Peter's cooperation and availability was necessary -the change, however, was the Lord's.
BUT - PETER HAD NOT YET "ARRIVED" IN THE ABOVE CHANGES.
HE HAD JUST BEGUN.
7. Gal. 2:11 - "...but when Cephas (Peter) came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face...."

Peter was still, in part, living by Jewish law and not by Grace. Change had not yet fully taken place'

Built into God's plan for our lives is TIME for change to take place.
